

RECYCLING

Jocelyn Township takes part in a recycling program through Municipal Waste and Recycling. The blue metal bins are located at the corner of Highway 548 and Highway 17 close to the Highway 17 E Trading Post. (St. Joseph Island Turnoff)

We ask that you sort and deposit items into correct bin. Do not pile around bin.

CARDBOARD WITH A 'CORRUGATED' WAFFLE AND BOXBOARD

NO PLASTIC OR WAXBOARD

- Flatten the cardboard to fit in the bin's slot
- No soiled cardboard
- Cereal
- Tissue
- Detergent
- Cardboard egg cartons
- Clean pizza boxes

GLASS BOTTLES AND JARS

- Only glass bottles and jars. When other glass items like light bulbs, window pane glass, drinking glasses, ceramics and china are mixed with the bottles and jars then the load of glass becomes unusable!
- Please rinse out bottles and jars
- Please remove lids
- You don't have to remove labels

COMMINGLED PLASTIC AND METAL FOOD BEVERAGE CONTAINERS

- Tin food and beverage cans
- Aluminum food and beverage cans
- Aluminum trays and foil
- Milk and Juice cartons and juice boxes – tetra paks
- Plastics: #1, #2, #3, #4, #5, #6 plastic food and beverage containers. They all go into the same bin
- Please rinse cans and containers
- For metal cans, push lid inside and squeeze top together
- Remove caps and lids from all plastic bottles
- You don't have to remove labels

NEWSPRINT

- Newspaper
- Flyers
- Magazines
- Catalogues
- Telephone books
- Paperback books
- Writing paper
- Envelopes

PLEASE CHECK!!

There are items labeled with the recycling symbol on the bottom, but that doesn't mean they can be recycled with this program.

The recycling symbol will be at the bottom of the plastic container with a number inside and/or the letters PETE or HDPE underneath it.

EXCEPTIONS

- #2 plastic bottles from motor oil, pesticides and herbicides containers cannot be recycled.

DO NOT DEPOSIT

- Tissues and paper towels
- Drinking glasses
- Window pane glass
- Ceramics
- China
- Light bulbs
- Coat hangers (plastic or metal)
- Diapers
- Hazardous waste, syringes or medicines
- Toys (plastic or other)
- Coffee cups
- Plastic pails with handles
- Bubble wrap
- Christmas wrap
- Styrofoam
